Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Hebrews 13:8

Many of you are perhaps wondering how it is possible that an entire year has come and gone! I always find myself in those days between Christmas and January 1st doing lots of reflection on God's faithfulness and goodness in all the chapters that marked the past 365 days. If you haven't done so, I would encourage you to take advantage of (hopefully) some less busy days after Christmas and spend time in reflection.

As we look at a calendar for 2024 that is not yet filled with events and activities, I would remind you of something that has already been stated at the start of this writing. Jesus remains the same. The author of Hebrews reminds us of this truth that often gets lost in the living of life.

One word of caution: you can agree with the truths I've shared about Jesus, and yet not have a heart that is being changed by Him! Now when I say heart, I'm not speaking about the physical organ in your chest that's pumping blood throughout your body to allow you to live. The heart in the Bible was thought to be a sort of "control center" from which all our decisions were made. So, when we read about the heart in Scripture, it is about the place where you have your will, your attitude, and intentions, which is the source of your thoughts, actions, and words. This heart is the core of who you are as a person. Your heart is, essentially, you.

As we turn the page from year to another, may the one who is constant, unchanging, and the foundation of our faith, Jesus Christ, transform your heart and life. Commit today to not being satisfied with status quo as a believer and as a church. Let us together move into the new year with the one who is the same yesterday, today, and forever!

THE ESSENTIAL JESUS CHALLENGE 100 DAY READING PLAN

Reading begins January 8 Reading planner handed out on January 7

On January 8, we as a church will begin reading selected Scripture about Jesus – 5 per week for 20 weeks.

On the following Sunday of each week Pastor Michael will have a sermon in line with the theme of that week.

We are asking everyone to participate, from adults through High School and Middle School, so as a unified Body of Believers, we are all reading, studying, learning about Jesus and growing in Jesus TOGETHER.

There is great benefit in reading and learning about Jesus as was explained in the "Make Much of Jesus" article. But let's make it a fun activity also. Consider having a "reading buddy". Go out to lunch - spend 10 or 15 minutes each week talking about Jesus and your Bible reading. Ask each other how each of you are doing on the reading plan. "Are you keeping up?" "What are you learning about Jesus?" "How/where have you seen Jesus work in your life this week?"

Remember, start reading on Jan 8 and read 5 passages each week. Then attend worship to hear what God has revealed to Pastor Michael on the week's theme.

Missionary Focus

The third Sunday of January has been designated as National Sanctity of Human Life Day. We say that Life Matters, but can we defend that biblically? Is the act of abortion addressed in the Bible? Even though the Bible does not refer to the matter directly, it is not silent on God's absolute moral standards.

- 1. First, human life is unique in that God created us in His image. In Genesis 1:26, God distinguished humans from the rest of the animal creation. We have the capability of rational thought, personality and moral responsibility.
- 2. The Bible forbids the shedding of innocent blood. Proverbs 6:16, 17 states that the LORD hates hands that shed innocent blood.
- 3. Pre-natal life is fully human and is precious to God. Job affirms that God's hands shaped and made him in his mother's womb in Job 10:8-12. Also, evidence that an unborn child is fully human is seen in Luke 1:35-36; 39-44. Mary while in her first trimester of pregnancy with Jesus visits her cousin, Elizabeth. Elizabeth is pregnant with John. John recognizes the person of Jesus in those early months of Mary's pregnancy.
- 4. Jesus' view of the value of children is noted In Luke 18:15-17. The disciples criticized parents for bringing their babies to Jesus so he could touch them. The disciples considered it an inconvenience, but Jesus rebuked them and welcomed the children. God shows his great love for us by calling us his children (I John 3:1). From the time of conception onward, we should have the same attitude as Jesus towards children.
- 5. God has a plan and a purpose for each individual. Psalm 139:16 reminds us that "Your eyes (God) saw my unformed body, all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be. "Taken from What the Bible Says About Abortion, bible.org 2004

We can all come to the defense of the unborn child by praying, voting pro-life, and supporting our local Pregnancy Center. Clinton's Pregnancy Center's mission is to preserve the life of the unborn child and to offer direction to women by providing physical, emotional and



spiritual support during pregnancy and beyond. Grief support for women suffering from a past abortion is available. The Center offers abstinence until marriage educational programs as well as educating the community on issues related to the Sanctity of Human life. Their services are free and confidential.

January Diaper Drive

One way we can come along side of The Pregnancy Center is to collect items needed for their boutique. The Center offers a boutique where women can obtain baby items. So far, this year 500 women have visited the boutique and 1,268 baby items have been distributed. Current needs include:

- * Diapers sizes 5-6-7
- * Pull-ups 2T-3T, 3T-4T, 4T-5T
- * Both Boys and Girls need 4T-5T clothes, boots
- * Wipes, bath & baby lotion

 Shampoo, conditioner, lotion, body wash, warm socks, gloves, slippers, snow boots

Bring an item or two to church any Sunday in the month of January to be donated to our local Pregnancy Center. Bless a new mom and her child.

MakeMuch of Jesus

If you are a regular attender, a member, or someone who frequents Journey Church, you probably noticed that our mantra or vision is "Make Much of Jesus". This is not just a cutsie saying or something we take lightly; it is something we as an Elder Board and hopefully we as a congregation take very seriously.

With December and Christmas being over, Jesus (or at least the manger scene) fades from the public square. So what do we do about the rest of the year? How about in January? How can we/you get into a monthly or even daily habit of making much of Jesus all year long? And why should we?

First, let's answer the how question. Starting in January, we will begin a Bible reading plan, which is entitled "The Essential Jesus Challenge". The plan provides 100 scriptures, which lay out who Jesus is and what He is all about in an easy, daily format of five Scriptures per week for 20 weeks. It is exciting to think that each day the entire congregation will all together be reading and contemplating the same Scripture about Jesus. And then each Sunday, Pastor Michael will recap the verses that we/you have just read throughout the week and

draw us into a better understanding of the theme or lesson found in these scriptures.

Now to answer the why question. Why does Journey Church "Make Much of Jesus", and why are we initiating the reading of "The Essential Jesus" plan? Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ lies at the very core of our belief system. Jesus has always existed. He was the Creator of all things. He didn't just arrive on the scene as a baby in a manger in the Gospels, but His presence is evident from Genesis 1 to the final chapter of the Bible where He proclaims He is the "...the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end" (Revelation 22:13, NIV). Why do we prioritize "making much of Jesus" versus spending a lot of time speaking about the current culture or something else? First because of who Jesus is (Colossians 1:15-20) but, also, if an individual gets this right, if they understand more fully Who Jesus is, why He came down to earth in human form, and what He taught, everything else in life will fall into place. Through Jesus and the workings of the Holy Spirit, as we read God's Word, the things of this world that are so confusing or hotly debated will become clear.

The Trustee Board has been busy with upgrading and repairs to the church facilities and property. The church was built in 1988 and in need of attention as it ages.

- The leak at the front of the sanctuary has been repaired and the front of the sanctuary painted.
- The tower was removed and front of the facade repaired underneath.
- Lights throughout the church were upgraded to energy efficient which not only provides better illumination but reduces the monthly bill.
- Original furnaces have been evaluated with repairs and replacement.
- The parking lot was resurfaced and striped this fall.
- Concrete curbs and sidewalk were replaced.
- Supporting structure for the emergency exits near the front of the building have been replaced.
- Landscaping peninsulas at the front of the church have been removed along with dead and overgrown plants. Plans are in place to have the remaining landscaping upgrade finished after winter.
