

Time Well Spent

I trust you noticed a different look to the front on this month's newsletter. The change is intentional as a reminder of our Vision 2024 to Make Much of Jesus. Each month we will share testimonies from our church family and leadership on how Jesus is impacting their lives and how they are learning more about Him in the process.

As I read this month's testimony, I'm grateful to hear the hearts of our elders to remind us that the resurrection of Jesus is a hope we can celebrate *every day*, and not just on Easter. Moving forward, I'm excited to hear more testimonies from the Journey family on what Jesus is revealing about Himself as we seek Him in our daily lives!

I love the verse above in the book of Acts and the courage being displayed by Peter and John. If we look closer, we discover what the source of that courage was in their lives. Simply put, it was because they had spent time with Jesus. If you look back in Acts 4 you discover that Peter and John had been arrested because the religious leaders were "greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus, the resurrection from the dead."

The next day when they had to answer the question, "By what power or what name did you do this?" Peter then spoke up (imagine that!) by the power of the Holy Spirit and in five verses shared a short yet powerful sermon on how salvation can be found nowhere else but in Jesus Christ "for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished, and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. Acts 4:13

I often remind everyone as we gather for worship on Sunday to be spending time with Jesus. I can't stress enough that this must go beyond attending the worship service once a week! We all spend much more time away from the physical building we call "the church." God gives us the gift of time. How we steward this time is our responsibility.








WEDNESDAY NIGHTS 6:15 - 7:45 PM AGES PRESCHOOL - 6TH GRADE

Missionary Focus Kyle and Carrie Eipperle



Kyle and Carrie and their young family accepted God's call to serve with SEND International in Ukraine in 2002. Kyle's primary ministry, initially, was to teach and


mobilize the Ukrainian church into cross-cultural missions. Kyle also began to develop Russian and Ukrainian language prayer guides. He became involved in research concerning unreached people groups and created prayer booklets and an internet site that featured people group profiles in the Russian language.

Unreached people groups are defined as a group of people distinguished by language or culture that are generally less than 2% Christian and lack the resources to evangelize that people group. There may be some Christians in a people group, but they do not have the ability to reach their own people with the gospel. This is usually due to insufficient training or not enough Christian workers. (Indopartners.com). Another ministry that Kyle pursued was the research of customs and culture of unreached peoples in areas where SEND could potentially begin church planting work.

When Ukraine became a missionary sending country, the family relocated to the United States in 2019. Yet, they did not feel the task that God had assigned them to do was finished. Kyle has since joined Operation World (OW), on loan from SEND International, as a research associate.

The primary focus of Operation World is research, and mobilizing prayer and mission for the nations. Their resources include global and regional trends, how they affect world mission, and how to pray. Kyle's responsibilities are to oversee the translation and distribution of OW materials to the Russian and Ukrainian language speaking world. These resources are valuable to inform missionaries where needs exist, specifically in eastern Europe. The goal for Operation World prayer guides is to have people from every nation, praying for people in every nation. Operation

World resources equip believers to respond to God's call for his people to pray.



The 7th edition OW prayer guide contains articles on 242 areas and territories; each article contains, among many things, information on the denominations, movements, and religions present. Gathering the breadth of data in and of itself

requires years of information gathering, researching, praying, networking and more. Once gathered, the data are analyzed and prayer points written, then they are reviewed by contacts made through the research gathering process. (operationworld.org)

Kyle researches from his home in Ohio, Illinois as well as attends conferences with others around the world as part of the necessary networking.

Kyle and his family will be visiting Journey church Sunday, April 14 to share about his ministry, update us on how God is using Operation World resources and to inform us about the state of Christianity around the globe. There will be a lunch following the church service, Kyle will speak at that time. Come hungry and come eager to better understand God at work around the world.
